I. Call to Order

III. Approval of Agenda

Superintendent Plackemeier gave HS report from Interim Principal Inglehart:

- Spring sports are well underway and the athletic department will be hosting several District tournaments this year soccer, baseball, and softball.
- The English Department worked on resume writing and invited numerous community members in to hold mock interviews with our 10th and 11th grade students.
- Twelve students were recognized at the Char-Em CTE banquet last week for their exemplary work in our six CTE programs.
- Two students have also successfully completed and passed the FAA certification test in Mr. LaPoint's unmanned aerial vehicle class.
- The Northmen Den Youth Services organization will be opening a youth food pantry in the high school. The pantry will be open to students on Tuesdays and Fridays throughout the school year. It is the same program as the Harbor Hut which has operated in the middle school for several years. One slight change is the high school Harbor Hut will also be open during the summer months and middle school students will also be invited to utilize the food pantry during this time.
- The Class of 2023 has five valedictorians and one salutatorian who will be honored and celebrated at both the Senior Honors Night (May 30) and Graduation (June 4).
- The members of the Class of 2023 have committed to colleges and postsecondary programs across the state, country and even internationally. We have one student attending a university in Ireland next year.

- This year's Commencement Speaker will be Mrs. Patti Chang, a graduate of HSHS and the Director of Outreach for the National Federation of the Blind.
- We are in the midst of the spring to the end of the school year at HSHS it's a fun and exciting time for both students and staff!

Superintendent Plackemeier gave MS report from Principal Keiser:

- Friday, May 12 is our final PBIS event of the school year. We have noticed a decline in behavior issues this year, and we are excited to plan more PBIS events for next school year.
- Our high school SAFE members will be presenting to our seventh grade students on Tuesday, May 16. They will focus on the importance of remaining substance free. SAFE Project Director Susan Pulaski will be onsite to assist the students through a workshop using the fatal vision goggles and other real-life simulations demonstrating the effect substances take on the body.
- On Wednesday, May 17, Megan McShannock and Thom Blanck will take 8th grade students to NCMC for a tour of their campus and presentations about what the college has to offer for dual enrollment and post high school education.
- The 5th grade Lansing trip is scheduled for Wednesday, May 24. Kim Hayhurst and Ethan McCarthy will be chaperoning. They will visit Abraham's Planetarium, Body Cafeteria on MSU's campus, Impression 5 Science Center, and get a tour of the State Capital Building.
- On May 30, numerous parent and community volunteers will assist with our 8th Grade Life Unplugged event. Students will learn about real life "adulting" responsibilities including paying insurance and utilities, balancing a checkbook, choosing a career, and raising a family. It's essentially a Game of Life simulation.
- The 8th Grade Chicago trip is scheduled for May 31 through June 2. We will catch a Cubs game, visit The Museum of Science and Industry and Shedd Aquarium, take an architecture cruise, see the Blue Man Group perform, and explore the city.
- The staff has lots of fun activities planned for the last day of school. The 8th graders will "graduate" and walk to the high school for their celebration parade. The other middle school grade levels will participate in a field day, swim at the pool, and go bowling and play laser tag. If any board members want to help chaperone, please let me know. It's a great day to spend with kids!
