Logic Pro X Unit 1

- 1) Voice / Layers: When creating you arrangements, consider the following:
 - Melody & Counter Melody (high voices)
 - Harmony (chords/strumming)
 - Bass (low)
 - Percussive (drums)
 - Stay Away From:
 - Block Arranging (all layers playing all the time)
 - O It's ok to have empty space in various layers.
 - Stair Case Arranging (one layer into another layer, one at a time)
 - Multiple movies at once.
- **2)** <u>Loop Filters:</u> Use the Loop Button (O) to open loops and the filters "Instruments", Genres", and "Descriptors" to search for your sounds. Click the "heart" button to save to your favorite list of loops.
 - Use Genre (style) to keep the loops you use relatable.
 - Think about Time / Key Signatures
 - o If you use a 12/8 drum track but a 3/4 melody, it might not line up.
 - Loop Tempo (bpm beats per minute)
 - O Some loops and sound waves are intended for a specific tempo.
 - They might not sound as good at a change tempo.
- 3) Balance & Mixing: Tips & Tricks to stay out of "red" (clipping / peaking / spiking) in the level meter
 - Set device volume at 75% (ish)
 - Set Master Volume at+0.0 dB
 - Use track heads / channel strips to mix
 - Adjust volume (up/down) and/or panning (left/right)
 - Adjust tracks indefinitely or
 - Adjust automation ("a")
 - Set loudest section in "yellow" or almost to "red"
 - Give listener as much volume as possible
 - Easier to decrease vs. increase volume
 - Hear all voices If you can't hear it, then why is it there?
 - Listen multiple ways: Cans, Speaker, Monitors, Devices
- 4) <u>Automation:</u> Use keyboard shortcut (a) to open automation or icon. You can automate almost any effect on the selected track. Click on track to create node. Nodes are movable. Select the Pencil for your cmd feature to create fast automation.
 - Main: volume, panning, mute
 - Control Panel: any effect related to the selected track such as tremolo, reverb, etc.
 - Effects / Plugins (found in mixer (x) window): what ever you can imagine

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- 5) Effects / Plugins: Access Effects/Plugins in the Mixer View (X) [mixer icons]
 - Effects can be found in the empty (sometimes) space in the mixer view just above the main controls.
 - Effects / Plugins all come with the individual Smart Controls
 - Within the Smart Controls you can:
 - Access Presets that are already configured for various styles
 - Configure the Effect to your own liking
 - Copy / Paste from the same Effect onto various tracks
- 6) <u>MIDI Editing:</u> When editing MIDI loops and tracks, open your Editor (E) [pencil icon]. You can switch between piano mode (notes show up as dots) and score mode (music notation).
 - Adjust Pitch (up and down)
 - Adjust Rhythm (left and right)
 - O Use Quantization feature to round selected rhythm to nearest duration
 - Select the smallest duration within the passage (ie 1/2, 1/4, 1/8)
 - Velocity (micro volume)
 - O The velocity will show up as color and line length within the node
 - Effects / Plugins
 - O You can add effects/plugins in this mode as well as the mixer mode (X)
 - Delete / Compose
 - O To delete an unwanted note, simple select/highlight and press "delete"
 - O To Add a missing note press and hold the "command" key with
- 7) <u>Virtual Drummer:</u> When using the Virtual Drummer, it is recommend to create and enter an Arrangement Track. This will auto-populate the arrangement per the header names. You can also adjust without the arrangement track, it just speed things along.
 - Use the Library (Y) to choose your Genre, Style, Drummer, and Kit Type
 - O Both Acoustic and Drum Machines are available
 - Use the Editor (E) to adjust individual clips or multiple clips at the same time
 - O Press shift+click to select clips
 - More options within the detail button
 - Use the Inspector (i) to access the Green button for (Drum Kit) Designer or micro edit you sound and options
 - O Click Acoustic Kit parts to select different models and modifying tuning/dampening
 - Click Drum Machine buttons to adjust multiple variables
 - Multiple sub-pages within this inspector

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- 8) <u>Arrangement Track:</u> When working within Logic Pro you can use the Arrangement Track or Markers to help organize your work. You can access this by the Global Track icon, press (G), or press cmd+shift+A specifically for the arrangement track. You can right click in the area to turn on/off other global track option.
 - O Sections can be renamed using pre-sets or custom
 - O Move the sections around to help explore arrangement options
